TOTEM BUILDING

Mrs. Dutchak's, Ms. Gatt's, and Ms. MacDonald's classes completed totem projects.

Mrs. Dutchak's and Ms. Gatt's students worked collaboratively in eight clans. They learned the history, purpose, and construction of totem poles. Each student selected an animal based on its meaning to the Northwest Coast cultures and created the animal out of paper maché and recycled objects. They then wrote a story of their totem pole. The totem poles and stories are on display in the portables.

Ms. MacDonald's students created totems as an introduction to their study of the differences between Aboriginal cultures of Canada. They will continue their work with posters and dioramas.
