Drop Off & Pick Up - Reminder

Drop off and pick up times are very busy at every school in the district and there is no easy solution or quick fix. We are fortunate to have roads on two sides and an alley on the third side of the school grounds. Please consider the following:

- Ensure the bus lane flows freely
